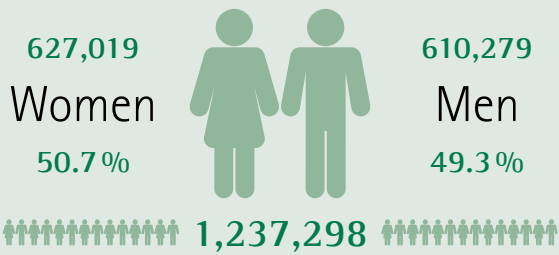

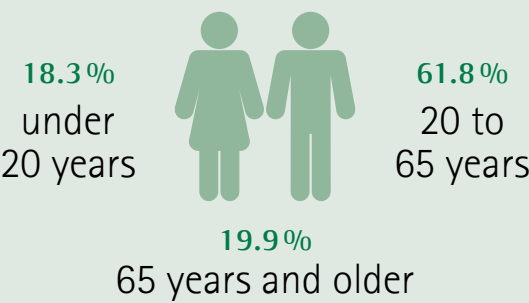

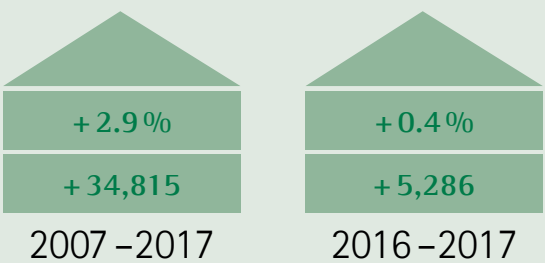


Age Groups

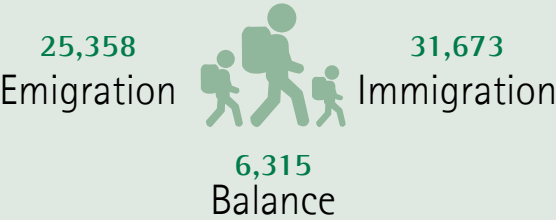

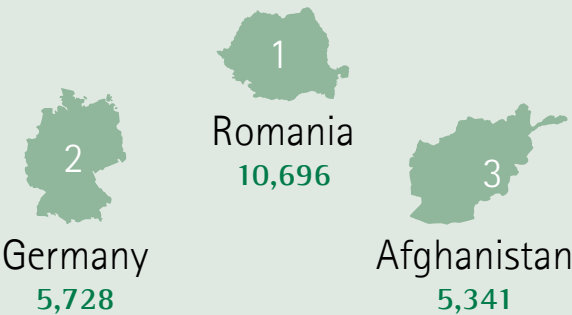


Migration 2016

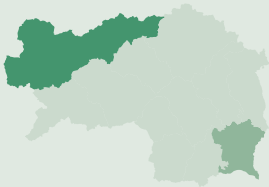

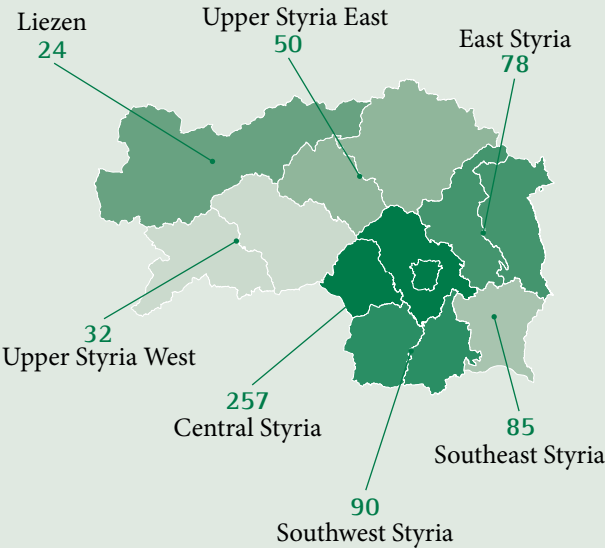

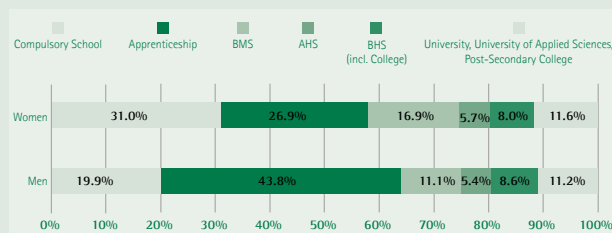

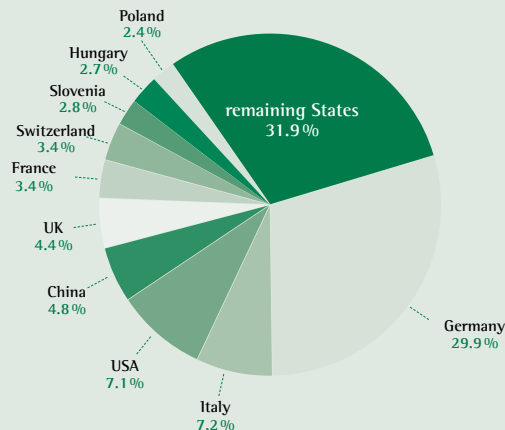

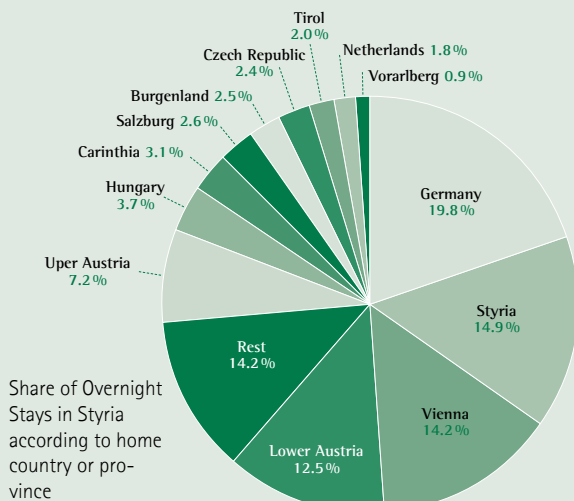
Styria: Exports 2016, Country Share in %
